## Local groups receive over £68,000 in donations from The Community Fund

The Enchanted Forest is operated by a charitable trust and last year, despite the challenges presented by COVID, we were still able to continue to support 29 local projects and organisations with cash donations amounting to over £68,000.

With no show having taken place in 2020, however, the trustees made the difficult decision to take a break from running a Community Fund initiative in 2021 to secure the reserves and guarantee the event will return in October 2021.

## A Pupdate on Cosmos

At the beginning of lockdown in March 2020, we received some pup-tastic news about the birth of Cosmos, a golden retriever and future "guide dog in training" that was named after our hugely successful 2019 Enchanted Forest show.

The Trust sponsored the guide dog after Guide Dogs Scotland (Perth & Kinross) was chosen as one of the official charity partners of the 2019 show.

Training a Guide Dog puppy in normal circumstances is challenging, however in the context of lockdown it has been even more so with less people and traffic around to help familiarise the pup with the obstacles they need to navigate in the real world.

Despite this, Cosmos's training continues to progress well and, thanks to regular Pup-dates from her trainer, we're delighted to hear that Cosmos is evolving into quite the model Guide Dog and is expected to go on to the very important role of becoming a future Guide Dog Mum herself this year, before completing her training.

## Tayside Mountain Rescue Missions Boosted by Forest Funds

In October, Tayside Mountain Rescue received a generous donation of £10,000 from The Enchanted Forest Community Trust to contribute to its life-saving activities. The charity, which operates in all weather, all terrain and at all hours, is a group of around 50 local volunteers sporting a plethora of specialist outdoor skills including remote medical expertise, technical rigging, swift water rescue and search management.

Like so many charities in the UK, Tayside Mountain Rescue's fundraising was adversely impacted by the pandemic.

Kevin Linklater, President of Tayside Mountain Rescue commented: "We are very grateful to The Enchanted Forest Community Trust for their timely donation. Like so many charities, we were forced to cancel several of our own fundraising events in 2020 and this donation will go a long way to boost our team funds. It is very much appreciated."
